### Notes

#### (Reference only) Legislation introduced thus far

- [AB 3](#) (Zbur): Offshore wind energy
  - Intent bill to accelerate offshore wind projects, reviewing approval process, etc. The language also notes the need to review environmental, social, economic impacts.
- [AB 9](#) (Muratsashi) | [SB 12](#) (Stern, Allen, & Wiener): CA Global Warming Solutions Act of 2006: emissions limit
  - Companion bills both hold the same language at this point. The current goal is 40% below '90 levels achieved by December 2030. These two bills change 40% to 55% below '90 levels achieved by December 2030.
    - It is possible this bill could see more substantive language beyond goal shifts.
- [AB 38](#) (Lee): Light pollution control
  - This bill has more substantive language. Starting in 2024, certain lights need to be dimmable, level of brightness, etc. Extinguishable by auto shut off, etc.
- [AB 43](#) (Holden): GHG emissions: building materials - credit trading platform and compliance system
  - Carbon credit trading on building materials. There was a previous bill on this issue that passed into law. AB 43 *could be* considered the next chapter.
- [AB 80](#) (Addis): Offshore Wind Coastal Protection Act
  - This bill would state the intent of the Legislature to enact future legislation to create the Offshore Wind Coastal Compensation Fund for purposes of mitigating the impacts of the deployment of offshore wind infrastructure in California, funding costs associated with the future decommissioning of obsolete offshore wind infrastructure, and providing funding.
- [SB 56](#) (Skinner): Load-Serving Entities: IRPs

- This bill “would make a non-substantive change” to the IRP provision re: diverse and balanced portfolio to meet several energy and climate policy targets.
- [SB 57](#) (Gonzalez): Extreme weather events.
  - This bill would state the Legislature’s intent to enact future legislation to prohibit shutting off utility service during extreme weather events.

  - **Apr. 10** Legislature reconvenes from Spring recess (J.R. 51(a)(2)).
  - **Apr. 28** Last day for policy committees to hear and report to fiscal committees fiscal bills introduced in their house (J.R. 61(a)(2)).
  - **May 5** Last day for policy committees to hear and report to the floor non-fiscal bills introduced in their house (J.R. 61(a)(3))
  - **May 12** Last day for policy committees to meet prior to June 5 (J.R. 61(a)(4)).
  - **May 19** Last day for fiscal committees to hear and report to the Floor bills introduced in their house (J.R. 61(a)(5)).
    - Last day for fiscal committees to meet prior to June 5 (J.R. 61(a)(6)).
  - **May 30-June 2** Floor Session Only. No committees, other than conference or Rules committees, may meet for any purpose (J.R. 61(a)(7)).
  - **June 2** Last day for each house to pass bills introduced in that house (J.R. 61(a)(8)).
  - **June 5** Committee meetings may resume (J.R. 61(a)(9)).
  - **June 15** Budget must be passed by midnight (Art. IV, Sec. 12(c)(3)).
  - **July 14** Last day for policy committees to meet and report bills (J.R. 61(a)(10)).
    - Summer Recess begins upon adjournment of session provided Budget Bill has been passed (J.R. 51(a)(3)).
  - **Aug. 14** Legislature reconvenes from Summer Recess (J.R. 51(a)(3)).
  - **Sept. 1** Last day for fiscal committees to meet and report bills to Floor (J.R. 61(a)(11)).
  - **Sept. 5-14** Floor session only. No committees, other than conference or Rules committees, may meet for any purpose (J.R. 61(a)(12)).
  - **Sept. 8** Last day to amend on the floor (J.R. 61(a)(13)).
  - **Sept. 14** Last day for each house to pass bills (J.R. 61(a)(14)).

- Interim Study Recess begins at the end of this day's session (J.R. 51(a)(4)).
- **Oct. 14** Last day for Governor to sign or veto bills passed by the Legislature on or before Sept. 14 and in his possession after Sept. 14 (Art. IV, Sec.10(b)(1)).
- Landscape/context:
  - First year of two year session.
  - Though bills have already been starting to be introduced, they largely begin rolling in following the holiday season/break (starting today).
    - Could see up to 5,000 bills introduced. Could anticipate ~150 bills worth tracking closely.
    - These bills at this point are largely boiler plate, or placeholder.
  - Expect Governor's early budget in January as required by the Constitution. This effectively sets up/frames legislative discussions re: budget over the next several months.
  - Continue to see indications that \$1B in spending for clean energy. Could be funded through budget document. We will also see policy changes in budget, through August.
  - Energy issues dealt with in big, leadership packages - elevated because of their importance to all Californians.
  - First leg of this process will run through late February with most bills introduced by then.
  - Assembly Speaker Rendon announced Chair positions through June 30, before transition:
    - A. Budget Sub Ctte Chair: Bennett. No announcement on the Senate side.
  - Karen Douglas moving to CPUC, awaiting on further details and timeline. Looking

- **CEC Workshop:** Energy Data Modernization & Analytics (Friday January 13, 1:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m.).
  - Staff present on CEC's advancements in its capabilities to collect and analyze data.
  - Panel 1: will discuss what data, and in what format, the CEC should prioritize to make publicly available + privacy concerns, etc.
  - Panel 2: will discuss data analysis as a service + tools to allow public to conduct their own analyses.

- **R.22-11-013**
- On 12/30, CPUC distributed a PD in the "**Click-Through**" proceeding (A.18-11-015 et al) extending the statutory deadline from 1/31/23 to 9/29/23
  - Reasons cited were:
    - 1) need to continue reviewing the record, and
    - 2) accommodate the availability of Commission resources
  - Expects that a PD addressing the issues will be issued "in the near future"
